Inclusive Innovation in Development Esoko Extension Service Model Empowers Farmers

Poor flow of real-time market information among farmers and traders that affects supply and demand

- SMS: weather, market prices, farming tips
- Call centers to answer questions
- Connects farmers to traders
- Mobilizes local community leaders

Esoko

Challenge

- Subscribers pay a small fee to receive SMS with price information
- 500,000 farmers served in 10 countries
- 11-25% increase in income
- Reduced cost of business transaction and cost of market information
- Increased negotiating power of farmers





World Bank Partnerships

- Improved fiscal balance, literacy rates and test scores, health visits, water quality index

Objective

Develop a market oriented agricultural services system based on partnerships between farmers, public agencies and private sector enterprises.

Expected Outcomes




