What is an EXPO?



- Expos in the beginning
 - First EXPO was held in London in 1851;
 - Some disorganised EXPOs were held before 1928;
- BIE (Bureau International des Expositions), based in Paris, was established in 1928 based on Convention Relating to International Exhibitions.
 - 170 countries are members of the BIE (as of May 2017).
 - It regulates and supervises proper application of the Convention.
- Japan is an original member of the BIE since 1928.



1. Basic information

- (1) Location
 Yumeshima Island (artificial island in Osaka Bay)
- **(2) Duration**May 3rd Nov. 3rd (185 days)
- (3) Number of Visitors (assumption) approx. 28mil to 30mil visitors
- (4) Construction costs for the venue(assumption) approx. 125 billion yen (0.96 billion euro)
- (5) Economic Impact (estimate)

Construction-related: approx. 0.4 trillion yen (30.8 billion-euro)
Operation expenses-related: approx. 0.4 trillion yen (30.8 billion euro)
Consumption-related: approx.1.1 trillion yen (84.6 billion euro)


